Dear Parents and Carers,

This week children at Cleves have been taking part in the TCS Mini London marathon with the aim being to run, jog, walk or wheel one mile in school between Monday 17 April and Friday 12 May. Thank you to Mr. Khan for coordinating the event.

Scheduled industrial action is due to take place on Tuesday 2nd May. The following classes will be closed:



I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that every child of school age is expected to be in school. By notifying the school via telephone (between 8:00 – 8:30) helps us to keep track of your child's attendance. 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
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The day the Ducklings came to visit Cleves
