Year 5 Visit Bank of England

Year 5 visited the Bank of England for an interactive session about 'Money and the Bank.' Before the session we were able to explore the Bank's Museum ... after going through security! In the museum we saw a replica of the Bank in the 1800s, the impact the Bank had on the Atlantic Slave Trade, learnt what the Bank of England does for us day to day and attempted to lift a real gold bar.

During our session, the speaker discussed the various job roles at the Bank of England, its history and showed us how bank notes were made by the Royal Mint. We couldn't believe that they are printed on huge sheets of paper and then cut. We also discussed how banks have changed over time due to technology. Many children asked how with our new monarch the money would change over time and the impact this would have on the value of older bank notes.

At Cleves, we want all children to be healthy and therefore have clear expectations on what should and shouldn't be in a packed lunch.

Attendance Reminder:

A pupil's absence during term time can seriously disrupt their learning.

Newham Local Authority are working closely with the school to monitor attendance and persistent lateness at Cleves.

Procedures to follow:

- If your child is unwell, you must inform the school office by <u>9:30.</u>
- If there is no known reason for the absence at registration, then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.
- Parents wishing to request a leave of absence must request a <u>Leave of Absence Form</u> from the school office. If this form is not completed in advance, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

When can my child be absent from school?

(Department for Education)

- Your child is too ill to attend that day.
- You have asked in advance and been given permission by the headteacher for your child to be absent on that day due to exceptional circumstances.
- Your child cannot attend school on that day because it is a day you are taking part in religious observance.
- Your local authority is responsible for arranging your child's transport to school and it is not available on that day or has not been provided yet.

These are the only circumstances where schools can permit your child to be absent.
